He began serving as Senior Pastor of the historic Riverside Chapel Seventh-day Adventist Church in 2006, where God continues to use him to add to this congregation's rich heritage, a progressive, Spirit-filled, mission-oriented ministry. He is married to the former Jennifer Gill. God has blessed their union with three sons—Furman III (PACE), Irvin Gill (PAX), and Jennings Walter (PRICE). Furman's personal purpose statement is to be a growing Christian, an adoring husband, an exceptional father, and an excellent pastor—simultaneously.

Riverside History

Riverside Chapel was formally organized in 1945 as a church originally in the fold of the Kentucky-Tennessee Conference of Seventh-day Adventists with a charter membership of 25. During the early 1940's, the medical staff of Riverside Hospital were faithful members of the Meharry Seventh-day Adventist Church in Nashville, Tennessee. On any given Sabbath as high noon was approaching, there was always a slight disturbance, a moving of bodies. Week after week, the same people – doctors, nurses and other medical personnel – would walk out of the services as quietly and unobtrusively as possible. Patients had to be fed; routine patient care had to go on. To satisfy the needs of the patients at the Riverside Sanitarium (later Riverside



Hospital) and to keep from disrupting the services at the Meharry Church, it was decided to organize a new congregation at the Sanitarium.

Thus, on the banks of the Cumberland River, Riverside Chapel was established March 10, 1945. The small group on "this side of the river" met in the dining room of the hospital and in a cottage on the "San" campus for the first ten years. Preaching service began at 9:00 a.m. and Sabbath School at 11:00 a.m. This enabled the pastor to serve both the Meharry and Riverside congregations. Riverside Chapel formulated an integral part of the hospital, but the church existed because the hospital existed. The hospital performed an important mission of the worldwide church and, through its medical service, represented Seventh-day Adventists to many who otherwise would not be acquainted with the organization.



In 1956, under the leadership of Elder Eugene Carter, a new church building (pictured) was erected and finally dedicated May 11-12, 1956. By this time, the membership had grown to 40-50 members including children. Some time later, Sabbath services were piped into the hospital enabling patients, visitors, and staff to see and hear the services. The minutes of the board meetings during those "good ole days" reflect similar problems facing churches today. Monthly tuition for the school was ten dollars per student (with 1/3 off for more than one child in the family). Finance reports, heating costs, conference meeting delegates, and

disciplinary issues were familiar matters for the Riverside Chapel of yesteryears. Today, the membership has grown to over 600.


